SUMMARY

Hi there! I am a political psychologist at CEVIPOF, Sciences Po Paris, with a background in political science, cognitive science and social psychology. I conduct cross-cultural experiments and develop theory to explore how people reason and communicate about sociopolitical topics. I'm in particular interested in the cognitive foundations and social goals of the following phenomena: fake news and conspiracy theories endorsement and spread, group-based biases, moralization processes, the politicization of scientific topics, the repression of speech on societal issues, how to make political conversations more productive, and cultural conservatism.

My **peer-reviewed articles** are presented below. They have appeared in *Nature Human Behavior*, the *European Journal Of Social Psychology*, *Political communication*, *PNAS Nexus*, *Nature Communications*, *Current Opinion In Psychology*, *Behavioral Public Policy*, *EMBO Reports*, *Annals of the New York Academy of Sciences* and *The Journal of Computational Social Science*, among others.

I teach political psychology and experimental design for psychology and social science.

I am a strong advocate of **open science** for both ethical and scientific reasons. I post all my data, R scripts, materials, and pre-register my studies on the Open science framework website (OSF). I also make all my papers open access on my website and on OSF, and when this is possible, from the journals as well.

I also value science communication. I have written multiple articles of science popularization and recorded podcasts since my Ph.D. My audiences have been the public (*The New York Times*, *The Conversation*, *The Dissenter*, *La Tronche en biais*, *Character and Context (SPSP)*), and policy makers (*Ministere francais des Armées*).
